FACTS & FIGURES

ECONOMIC SECURITY



401,000 people received food and essential household items.

Livelihood support in the form of cash assistance and agricultural support was provided to over

407,000

PEOPLE DEPRIVED OF FREEDOM



ICRC conducted **50** visits to places of detention across Somalia. **4,500** detainees benefited from detention related activities including medical support, hygiene, rehabilitation of infrastructure and vocational training.

HEALTH



462,000 people accessed health services from ICRC supported hospitals and Somali Red Crescent Society (SRCS) clinics. **31,000** malnutrition cases were treated, including **4,600** children under-five with medical complications.

RESTORING FAMILY LINKS



126,000 people were helped to re-establish contact with relatives. This was done with the support of the SRCS through Red Cross Messages (RCMs), phone calls and having names read out in the 'Missing Persons' radio program on BBC Somali.

WATER AND HABITAT



244,000 people have improved access to safe drinking water through digging of boreholes, wells and the installation of rainwater harvesting catchments.

INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW

800 army officers and **1,000** community leaders, journalists, SRCS volunteers and staff from ICRC were sensitized on IHL through education sessions and distribution of ICRC publications on code of conduct in armed conflict.
