## Activities Highlights

Ukraine crisis. September 2017

Over 490 staff members based in Kyiv, Donetsk, Luhansk, Mariupol, Sloviansk, Sievierodonetsk and Odesa.



### Health Care

18

**medical facilities** on both sides of the contact line were supported with drugs, dressing materials, vaccines, immune globulins, and essential medical equipment.

7

**primary health-care** structures received chronic disease medications.

13,000

**blood test systems** were donated to blood banks in Donetsk and Luhansk.

100

**people** providing psychosocial support in communities participated in seven training sessions (Helping the Helpers).

125

**people** residing along the contact line received direct psychosocial support.

25

**families of the missing** were provided with psychosocial accompaniment.

**Sports equipment** was donated to an organization for disabled people.



### Caring for the Dead

70

**forensic experts** participated in disaster and mortuary management workshop conducted by the ICRC at the conference of heads of medico-legal bureaus in Zaporizhia.



### Mine Risk

600

**marking signs** and **20 km of marking tape** were provided to Vinnytsia region after the explosions at the ammunition depot in Kalynivka.

13

**mine awareness billboards** were installed, including seven on the Horlivka Highway.

340

**people** took part in 17 Mine Risk Education sessions, and **over 440** Mine Risk Education posters and leaflets were distributed among people residing along the contact line.

785

**marking signs**, **29 rolls of marking tape**, **500 wooden poles**, and **five demining equipment sets** were donated to relevant structures on both sides of the contact line.



### Water & Habitat

over 8,000

**people** on both sides of the contact line were ensured sustainable access to drinking water thanks to a new power line built for the Olenivka Pumping Station.

2

**water towers** were raised in Popasna, enabling renewal of water supply to houses of over 5,000 residents of the town.

over 3,000

**residents** of 15 localities on both sides of the contact line received construction materials for structural rehabilitation of their damaged houses.

6

**localities** benefited from support to water infrastructure, including donation of water treatment chemicals.

3

**medical facilities** received construction materials for infrastructure rehabilitation.

110

**meters of pipes** were donated for the rehabilitation of the municipal water supplying network in Toretsk.



### Detention

7

**places of detention** were visited, and the situation of **81 detainees, including 24 newly registered**, was monitored. **64** short oral and written **messages** were exchanged between detainees and their families.



### Family Links

20

**families of missing persons** received cash assistance.

2

**families** received transportation assistance to reunite with their family members separated as a consequence of the armed conflict.

6

**tracing requests** for persons unaccounted for were resolved, and **25 new tracing requests** were received.

The photo exhibition *Uncertainty - Families of the missing on both sides of the contact line* was unveiled in Mariupol.



### Economic Security

27,000

**people** received 17 kg food parcels each.

27,000

**people** received essential hygiene items such as soap, washing powder and shampoo.

1,750

**households** were supported with cash assistance for their livestock recovery activities. **Over 40 people** were trained on how to better manage their livelihoods.

over 2,000

**people** residing in 15 localities received chickens and animal fodder to maintain their livestock.

12

**families** of people injured or deceased due to the conflict provided with cash assistance.



### Armed & Security Forces

30

**UAF personnel** participated in a seminar on IHL.



### Cooperation with the URCS

1,680

**patients** were visited by doctors of three URCS mobile clinics: 62 trips to 50 localities, including seven trips accompanied by the ICRC team to places near the contact line.

250

**vulnerable people** were assisted by the URCS home-visiting nurses, with the financial support from the ICRC.

164

**URCS volunteers** participated in implementation of joint ICRC-URCS programmes.

220

**people** participated in 14 First Aid trainings facilitated by volunteers of the Local Red Cross in Luhansk, with the financial support from the ICRC.

over 73,500

**people** were assisted by URCS volunteers and feldshers at Stanytsia Luhanska crossing point, with the financial support from the ICRC.
