



# ICRC IN SOMALIA

January to December 2014

## FACTS & FIGURES

### ECONOMIC SECURITY



Nearly **684,000** people benefited from ICRC's emergency response. The response included food distributions, destocking livestock due to the drought and sandbags to bolster river banks.

Over **956,000** people were beneficiaries of livelihood programs that provide cash assistance and agricultural support.

### PROTECTION



**4,600** people were reached through detention-related activities. These activities include visits to places of detention to assess conditions and ensure detainees are treated humanely and with dignity. Vocational training for prisoners and rehabilitation of prison facilities were also carried out.

### HEALTH



Close to **422,000** people benefited from quality medical supplies to hospitals and Somali Red Crescent Society (SRCS) clinics. Rehabilitation of medical facilities and capacity building of medical staff to improve the quality of healthcare was also carried out.

### RESTORING FAMILY LINKS



Over **67,000** people were helped reestablish contact with relatives. This was done with support from the SRCS through Red Cross Messages (RCMs), phone calls and tracing services including having their names read out in the "Missing Persons"

### WATER AND HABITAT



More than **256,000** people had improved access to safe water supplies and better sanitation conditions.

### INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW

**295** officers received information on IHL through training sessions and distribution of ICRC-publications on code of conduct in armed conflict.
