## “What is Humanitarian Work?” Drawing Contest

Many people know about humanitarian work through leading international organizations such as International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent (IFRC), Oxfam (OXFAM), United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and World Food Organization (WFP). However, many of them still do not fully understand what constitutes humanitarian work; many people often think of refugees only. Such perception shows a vague and incomprehensive understanding of the full context of “humanity”.

The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement is a global humanitarian network of more than 150 years of experience working in the frontlines of humanitarian activities across the globe. The Movement comprises three components: International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC); the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent (IFRC) and; the national Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, such as the Thai Red Cross, the Cambodian Red Cross or the German Red Cross.

Despite being under the same Movement, these three separate components are assigned with different mandates, such as;

- The ICRC works to help communities and people affected by wars, conflicts or other situations of violence. Its activities include dissemination of International Humanitarian Law (IHL), improving the living conditions of those in prison, ensuring healthcare in detention, and restoring family links.
- The IFRC works to help vulnerable communities and people to cope with various types of disasters such as floods, pandemics, forest fires, earthquakes, and tsunamis, as well as provide training to local authorities responsible for the disasters.
- The Thai Red Cross carries out various activities such as running blood drives, providing holistic public health services, disaster relief assistance, and red cross youth and elderly volunteer assistance.

### **Types of mediums that can be submitted for the contest**

- Draw or paint by hand on any type of paper or canvas on the topic of “What is humanitarian work?” Participants can choose a theme based on their aptitude, such as the work of the International Red Cross (ICRC), the Thai Red Cross (TRC), or the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) (more information can be found on the organizations’ websites, Facebooks or other medias). The work must be on at least an A3-size. Applicants can choose to use colors or techniques according to their aptitude, but they are not allowed to use any digital design program or application to create the work.

- Applicants have to include the title and description of the work in the application form.

The scoring criteria will be divided into two main parts:

Part I:

1.1 70% of the score will be decided by a panel of judges representing each organization, including senior artists and three other artists who work with the organization on this project.

1.2 30% of the score will be decided according to the number of shares and reactions on the International Red Cross (ICRC) Facebook page, where online voting will be available from November 24 to December 1, 2020, as follows:

- 1 share counts as 3 points.

- 1 reaction (like, love, care etc.) counts as 1 point.

- There is no limit to the number of entries submitted to the contest.

### **Judging Criteria**

Criteria for evaluating the drawing contest on the topic of “What is humanitarian work?” includes the composition, creativity, techniques, conformity to the chosen topic, layout and the overall meaning of the drawing or painting.

### **Award announcement**

The results of the contest will be announced on December 1, 2020 on the Facebook pages of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) and Thai Red Cross Society (TRC). The selected works will be exhibited along with the works of three other participating artists in Bangkok (venue to be announced).

### **The awards will be given in three categories, as follows:**

#### The ICRC Humanitarian Work:

The winner – THB 9,000 prize money and a certificate

1<sup>st</sup> Runner Up – THB 6,000 prize money and a certificate

The IFRC Humanitarian Work:

The winner – THB 9,000 prize money and a certificate

1<sup>st</sup> Runner Up – THB 6,000 prize money and a certificate

The Thai Red Cross Humanitarian Work:

The winner – THB 9,000 prize money and a certificate

1<sup>st</sup> Runner Up – THB 6,000 prize money and a certificate
