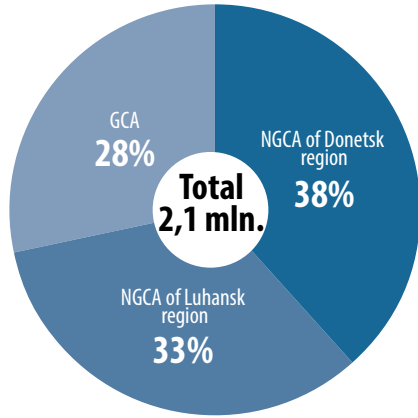
ICRC Activities Overview

Ukraine crisis 2015

In Ukraine the ICRC is helping people affected by the conflict in the east of the country.

people assisted through donation of **construction materials**.

people benefited from assistance to **water boards and electricity supply companies**.

Economic Security

650,000

food rations distributed to **355,335** people.



over **660,000**

hygiene parcels and various household items distributed to **370,944** people.



2,500

people in Lysychansk, Rubizhne and Sieverodonetsk were receiving **bread** daily during the first half of the year.



Heating

6 villages on the front-line, supported with **wooden briquettes** for heating during the winter.



over **13,000**

people received **cash assistance**, including those who worked on rehabilitation of houses damaged during the conflict.



over **12,000**

detainees received food assistance and various non-food items on NGCA.



over **15,000**

people staying in some **80 social institutions** received food assistance and various hygiene items on NGCA.

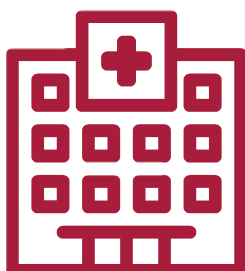


Agriculture

Over 340 staff members (more than 270 residents and 75 expatriates) working in offices located in Kyiv, Donetsk, Lugansk, Mariupol, Sloviansk, Sievierodonetsk and Odesa. The budget of the ICRC in Ukraine for 2016 is about 65 million US\$.
