Ukraine crisis. October 2017

500 staff members based in Kyiv, Donetsk, Luhansk. Mariupol, Sloviansk, Sievierodonetsk and Odesa



Health Care

over vials of insulins were donated in 150,000 Donetsk for treatment of diabetic

- primary health care structures on both sides of the contact line received chronic disease medications.
- hospitals were supported with essential medical equipment and materials
- school psychologists participated in five training sessions on psychosocial support.
- people received psychosocial support during group sessions and home visits.
- wheelchairs were donated to a social facility in Donetsk.
- **people** participated in two basic first aid trainings conducted by the ICRC/URCS.



Armed & Security Forces

- **93 UAF personnel** participated in three seminars on IHL and the ICRC.
 - senior UAF officers attended the ICRC's annual international Senior Workshop on Rules Governing Military Operations, in Mexico.
- **police officers** took part in a seminar on IHL and International Rules and Standards for Policing.



Mine Risk

- marking signs, three rolls of marking tape and 69 IMAS cards were provided to relevant structures on both sides of the contact line.
- people took part in 9 MRE sessions, and over 1,600 MRE posters and leaflets were distributed among people residing along the contact line.
- volunteers of the local Red Cross in Luhansk participated in four days training on explosive remnants of



Water & Habitat

heating radiators, 390 meters of pipes and three air conditioning units were donated to the pediatric cardio surgery department of a health care facility.

education and health facilities in Toretsk district received water tanks for storage of 28,000 liters of water in total. **One school** received insulation materials and PVC windows.

morque benefited from donation of gates and fence materials.

over residents of seven localities received construction materials for structural rehabilitation of their damaged houses.

localities on both sides of the contact line benefited from support to water infrastructures, including donation of water treatment chemicals.



Caring for the

- morgues on both sides of the contact line benefited from donation of mortuary trolleys and a refrigerating system.
- representatives of CIMIC and the National Police participated in Forensic Human Identification Course in Milano, with the support of



Family Links

- families of missing persons received cash assistance.
 - family received transportation assistance to reunite with its family member separated as a consequence of the armed conflict.
- new tracing requests for persons unaccounted for were received.

Economic Security

48,000

people received 17 kg food parcels

48,000

people received essential hygiene items such as soap, washing powder and shampoo.

35,000

people at Stanitsa Luhanska crossing point were provided with shelter and hot drinks, and were assisted by 27 URCS volunteers and two paramedics.

households were assisted with 167 pellets and wooden briquettes for the heating of their houses.

families of people injured or 18 deceased due to the conflict were provided with cash assistance.

2,000

households received animal feed (558 tons in total) for maintaining of their livestock.

1,300

people received monthly cash assistance.



Cooperation with the URCS

- **bicycles** were provided for the URCS home-visiting nurses who assist vulnerable people in Donetsk and Luhansk region.
- police officers attended first aid training conducted by the URCS in Pokrovsk, with the support from the
- volunteers participated in implementation of joint ICRC-URCS programmes.
- people participated in MRE and first aid trainings facilitated by volunteers and staff members of the local Red Cross in Luhansk, with the financial support from the ICRC.



Detention

- places of detention were visited, and the situation of 17 detainees, including five newly registered, was monitored.
- short oral messages and written messages were exchanged between detainees and their families.
