



Activities Highlights

Ukraine crisis. January 2018

500 staff members based in Kyiv, Donetsk, Luhansk. Mariupol, Sievierodonetsk, Sloviansk and Odesa

Health Care



- primary health care facilities received chronic disease medications.
- **persons participated** in three first aid trainings.
- health care and social workers participated in 11 trainings on psychosocial support.
- group sessions and home visits were conducted to provide psychosocial support for people residing along the contact line.
 - relatives of the missing were provided with psychosocial support.

Detention

- detainees, including three newly registered were visited by ICRC delegates.

Mine Risk

- persons on both sides of the contact line took part in five mine risk education sessions.
- mine risk education posters and leaflets were distributed among 110 people residing along the contact



Water & Habitat

residents of Popasna town were provided with sustainable access to drinking water thanks to the opening 4,000 of two new water towers, installed with support from the ICRC instead of damaged one.

m of pipes, 5 submersible pumps, one welding generator set were donated to the main water and sewage company of Donetsk region.

> localities on both sides of the contact line benefited from support to water infrastructure, e.g. donation of water treatment chemicals, supply of necessary materials and machinery equipment.

tons of water treatment chemicals 100 were delivered to the main water treatment facility in Luhansk region.

people in six localities on both sides of the contact line benefited from a donation of tools for working brigades and construction materials **500** for rehabilitation of the damaged houses, including emergency repairs.



-1-1- Crossing Points

people, including 932 persons with disabilities and children, visited the Red Cross heating points on both 43.000 sides of the bridge at Stanytsia Luhanska, and were assisted by Red Cross volunteers.

hot drinks were served to people at 18,000 Stanytsia Luhanska crossing points.

- heating/cooling points at Zaitseve, Oleksandrivka and on both sides of the Stanytsia Luhanska bridge crossing points were maintained by the ICRC.
- crossing points at Marinka, Berezove and Stanytsia Luhanska benefited from ICRC's maintenance of latrines



Family Links

- families of missing persons received cash assistance.
- families received transportation assistance to reunite with their family members separated as a consequence of the armed conflict.
- **new tracing requests** for persons unaccounted for were received.
- tracing requests were closed. 671 cases of missing persons registered with the ICRC since the beginning of the conflict remain open.



Economic Security

over 20,000 **people** received 17 kg food parcels each, which include buckwheat, rice, pasta, flour, sunflower oil, sugar, canned beef and sardines, tea and yeast.

20,000

people received essential hygiene items such as soap, washing powder and shampoo.

individuals in the GCA received cash assistance to recover their 285 livestock and crop-production activities.

households were supported with 1,000 3,000 tons of coal.

pairs of shoes were donated to children in rehabilitation centers and 638 boarding schools.

4,600

households in 25 localities in GCA received cash assistance during December and January to improve their living conditions during wintertime.

62 households received greenhouses.

1,600

people in the GCA received monthly cash assistance to cover their basic needs.



Armed & **Security Forces**

law enforcement officers participated in a seminar on international standards for policing.



Cooperation with the URCS

volunteers contributed to ICRC distributions of aid, repair of houses, implementation of first aid and psychosocial support programmes.

children and 40 adults attended five puppet shows, organized by two URCS volunteers to provide psychological relief, with the support 333 of the ICRC.

vulnerable persons in Donetsk and Luhansk regions were assisted by 43 URCS home-visiting nurses, supported by the ICRC.
