Ukraine, August 2018

525 staff members based in Kyiv, Donetsk, Luhansk, Mariupol, Sievierodonetsk, Sloviansk and Odesa



Health Care

75,000

flacons and cartridges of insulin were donated to medical facilities to cover the needs of patients with

- hospitals on both sides of the contact line were supported with antibiotics, intravenous fluids and other medical items to provide medical care to the weapon-wounded and the sick.
 - primary health care facilities on both sides of the contact line received medical items.
 - rehabilitation facilities were supported with wheelchairs, spare parts for prosthetic devices and raw materials for prosthetics production.
- training sessions on how to provide psychosocial support were conducted for 49 participants.

around 140

people residing along the contact line received **psychosocial support** during 116 group sessions and home

families of missing people were provided with psychosocial support.



Caring for the

- forensic facilities, one body search and recovery team and one police department on both sides of the contact line benefited from donations of forensic equipment.
- representatives of the UAF, National Guard and Prosecution Academy were informed about IHL obligations towards the dead and ICRC actions in supporting the process of search for missing persons and the identification process.
- **relatives of missing persons** were informed about the evaluation of the identification process.



Detention

- detainees, including 16 newly registered detainees, were visited by ICRC delegates in nine places of 100 detention in GCA.
- short oral and written messages were exchanged between detainees and their families.
- penitentiary staff in GCA were trained on international standards of the treatment of detainees.



Family Links

- families of missing persons received cash assistance.
- **new tracing requests** for persons unaccounted for were received.
- tracing requests were closed. 702 cases of missing persons registered with the ICRC since the beginning of the conflict remain active.
- family received transportation assistance to reunite with their family member separated as a consequence of the armed conflict.



Water & Habitat

300

around residents of Nikishyne will benefit from the rehabilitation of the local ambulatory.

tons of salt and 20 tons of calcium

hypochlorite were provided to the main water supply and sewage company of the Donetsk region for water treatment. The company also received support for its infrastructure: 24 water pumps, three sewage pumps, seven electric motors, seven frequency controllers, formatical formations. four valves.

localities on both sides of the contact line benefited from support to water infrastructure, including donation of water treatment chemicals, supply of necessary materials and machinery equipment.

people in 13 localities on both sides of the contact line received **tools and** construction materials for the 1.000 rehabilitation of damaged houses, including emergency repairs.

households benefitted from 2.000 installation of PVC windows.



Safer Schools

teachers and pupils benefitted from rehabilitation of facilities and the installation of anti-blast film in one school



Cooperation with the URCS

about 390

Red Cross volunteers participated in joint distributions of aid, repair of houses, implementation of first aid, psychosocial support, risk awareness and safer behavior programmes.

patients residing in villages close to the contact line were assisted by four over URCS mobile clinics, with the support of the Finnish Red Cross and 2,100 the ICRC

elderly people living alone, including persons with disabilities, on both sides of the contact line, were assisted by 107 Red Cross homevisiting nurses, supported by the

URCS volunteers improved their first aid skills during a training session for instructors, with ICRC financial support. 16 volunteers participated in an IHL training in Rubizhne.

children in Avdiivka attended a puppet performance organized by URSC volunteers with support from the ICRC, aimed at providing psychological relief.



Economic Security

28,000

people on both sides of the contact line each received 17kg food parcels, which include buckwheat, rice, pasta, flour, sunflower oil, sugar, canned beef and sardines, tea and

28.000

people on both sides of the contact line each received **hygiene parcels** containing essential items such as soap, washing powder and shampoo.

21,500

households received in total 107 tons of sugar for fruit processing.

families received support for their livestock: 12 tons of chicken feed, tools and equipment.

greenhouses were provided to households on both sides of the contact line.

seed kits were provided for people to 1.050 support their farming activities.

children were provided with school kits. 2.260

> entrepreneurs received grants for their business projects in GCA.

people were assisted with bed linen, 280 pillows, blankets, etc.

social institutions were assisted with necessary household items: furniture, kitchen equipment, pillows, bed linen, etc.

tons of wooden briquettes were provided to three social institutions serving 850 individuals.



Mine Risk

around 60

children in one locality will benefit from a **safe playground** where they can play despite a high level of contamination in the area.

children attended mine risk **200** awareness performances.

around 470

people on both sides of the contact line took part in 22 **mine risk** education sessions.

3,300

mine risk education posters and leaflets were distributed to people residing along the contact line.

marking signs and 1,500 rolls of 150 marking tape were donated to relevant authorities



- military personnel in GCA participated in two seminars on IHL and the ICRC.
- law enforcement personnel participated in two **seminars** on IHL and international rules and standards for policing.
