Health Care

primary health care facilities on both sides of the LoC received medications to treat chronic diseases (e.g. diabetes, asthma, hypertension, ischemic heart disease). Two hospitals were supported with medicines and other medical items to provide medical care to weapon-wounded and sick.

1.500 blood bags were donated to a blood

> teachers, healthcare workers and community leaders in six localities along the LoC were provided with 60 psychosocial support.

residents of four localities along the over LoC received psychosocial support 50 during 63 group sessions and home

people residing along the LoC were trained in basic first aid. 70

persons with disabilities benefited from ICRC societal inclusion programme, which includes donation 500 of walking aids and wheelchairs, and supports a social inclusion campaign.

Caring for the Dead

body was transferred across the LoC with ICRC support.

families were supported to cover funeral expenses.

forensic practitioners participated in a conference on current challenges of medico-legal system.

representatives of the National Police and forensic institutions participated in ICRC workshop in Italy on forensic identification of the dead from armed conflicts and catastrophes.

UAF and Border Guard Service officials were informed about IHL obligations towards the dead.

Missing

families of missing persons received cash assistance.

families of missing persons were provided with psychosocial support.

cases of missing persons registered with the ICRC since the beginning of the conflict remain active.

Family Links

new tracing requests for persons unaccounted for were received.

tracing requests registered with the ICRC were closed.

family was assisted with transport to reunite with their family member separated as a consequence of the armed conflict.



Respect for IHL

representatives of Ukrainian National Commission of IHL visited the German Committee of IHL in Berlin with support from the ICRC, to engage in peer-to-peer dialogue and cooperation.



Water & Habitat

km water pipe was constructed to provide residents of a contact line with centralized water supply from existing over water network

families on both sides of the LoC, whose homes were destroyed due to the conflict, moved in to new houses constructed by the ICRC.

tons of aluminium sulphate for water treatment were provided for the main water supply and sewage company of the Donetsk region. 200

> medical facilities were supported with onstruction materials (cement, bitumen primer, etc.) and rehabilitation works, including restoration of water supply system for Krasnohorivka ambulatory.

forensic institutions were supported with torerisic institutions were supported with construction works, construction materials (timber, pipes, plastic doors/windows, insulation wool, etc.) and equipment (air conditioners, cold chambers, radiators, water boilers, etc.).

autopsy room was renovated in Kostiantynivka morgue.



Access to Education

teachers and pupils benefitted from improvement of facilities and the installation of anti-blast film in nine schools 1,500 and kindergartens on both sides of the

> educational institutions on both sides of the LoC were assisted with essential household items: detergent, dishes and kitchenware, appliances and light bulbs.



Mine Risk

children on both sides of the LoC over improved their knowledge of mine/ERW risks as a result of 24 1,800 theatrical performances.

people on both sides of the LoC improved their knowledge of mine/ERW risks during 45 information sessions, including those conducted in cooperation with the URCS. 550

mine risk education posters and 5,000 **leaflets** were distributed to people residing along the LoC.

> mine awareness billboards were installed in nine localities along the LoC. 28

marking signs were donated for installation near Marinka crossing point.

URCS volunteers were trained on how to teach safer behaviour and mine/ERW risk



Armed & Security Forces

CIMIC officers, UAF legal advisers and commanders participated in two sessions on IHL and ICRC activities.

university professors and SSU officers participated in two sessions on international rules and standards for policing and other related topics.



Economic Security

around 36,000

people on both sides of the LoC each received 17kg food parcels, which contain buckwheat, rice, pasta, flour, sunflower oil, sugar, canned beef and sardines, tea and yeast.

around 36,000

people on both sides of the LoC each received **hygiene parcels** containing essential items such as soap, washing powder and shampoo.

6,700

households in 55 localities along the LoC received coal for heating during winter time.

around 2,500 individuals in GCA received cash for their livestock and farming activities.

2,100

households received in-kind support for their livestock and farming activities: fertilizers, fodder, grinding machines, brooders, milk separators, stoves.

70

households were trained on how to tend their livestock and generate income for their household.

600

persons in GCA received cash assistance to cover their basic needs.

over 30

families of persons injured or deceased due to the conflict were provided with cash assistance (GCA).

2,000

persons benefited from support provided to 10 social institutions (24 tons of wooden briquettes, blankets, hygiene parcels, etc.).



Cooperation with the URCS

almost 2.000

patients residing close to the LoC were assisted by four URCS mobile clinics, with support of the Finnish Red Cross and the ICRC.

680

elderly people living alone, including persons with disabilities, on both sides of the LoC, were assisted by 107 Red Cross home-visiting nurses (e.g. help with housekeeping, maintenance of personal hygiene, etc.), supported by the ICRC.

around 70

Red Cross volunteers participated in the National Volunteers Assembly, organised with support of the ICRC and Danish Red Cross.

over 30

sets of dressing material and first aid kits were provided to the URCS to support its emergency preparedness capacity.

about 240 Red Cross volunteers participated in joint distributions of aid, reparation of houses, first aid, psychosocial support, risk awareness and safer behavior programmes.



Detention

detainees, including 18 newly registered detainees, were visited by ICRC delegates in 13 places of detention in GCA. 122

short oral and written messages were exchanged between detainees and their families.

set of technical equipment for organization of online learning and one mannequin for training of detention medical workers were provided to Bila Tserkva education center for penitentiary staff.
