

## **International Committee** of the Red Cross (ICRC)

#### **Activities Highlights**

Ukraine. January - February 2019

540 staff members based in Kyiv, Donetsk, Luhansk, Mariupol, Sieverodonetsk, Sloviansk and Odesa

#### **Health Care**

- **hospitals** on both sides of the LoC were supported with antibiotics, dressing material, intravenous fluids and anaesthesia sets to provide medical care to weapon-wounded and
- **primary health care facilities** on both sides of the LoC received NCD medications.

around 150

- URCS volunteers, community workers and teachers learned how to provide first aid during 11 trainings.
- health care and social workers, school teachers participated in 13 trainings on psychosocial support.
- **people** residing along the LoC received **psychosocial support** during 172 group sessions and home

around 45,000

insulin cartridges and flacons were donated to cover the needs of patients with diabetes

### **Crossing Points**

80,000

people were assisted by Red Cross volunteers at the heating/cooling points on both sides of the bridge at Stanytsia Luhanska and at Maiorske crossing points.

- first aid point at Stanytsia Luhanska crossing point was supported with chronic diseases medications, intravenous fluids and infusion sets.
- crossing points benefited from ICRC's maintenance of latrines and waste containers.
- posters and leaflets distributed at a 1.500 crossing point to improve knowledge of about mine/ERW risks.



## **Family Links**

- families received transportation assistance to reunite with their family members separated as a consequence of the conflict.
- **new missing cases** for persons unaccounted for were received. **Six** missing cases were closed.
- cases of missing persons registered with the ICRC since the beginning of the conflict remain open. 753
- families of missing persons received cash assistance. 41 relatives of the missing were provided with psychosocial support.



### Armed & **Security Forces**

- police officers, professors and students participated in three seminar on international standards for policing and IHL.
- representatives of the UAF Naval **Infantry** participated in a seminar on IHL and the ICRC.



#### Water & Habitat

tons of activated carbon for water treatment was donated to the main water supply and sewage company in Luhansk region.

m3 water tank was refurbished to eliminate risk of its leakage. Six 5,300 localities benefited from support to water infrastructure, e.g. supply of materials and equipment.

> detention facility was supported with materials for its sewage system to improve conditions of detention.

around 1,000

**people** in seven localities on both sides of the LoC benefited from tools and construction materials donated for the rehabilitation of damaged houses, including emergency repairs. One family, whose house was heavily damaged due to the conflict, moved into a newly constructed home.



# Caring for the

- forensic institutions and a police department received equipment and furniture for body examinations.
- families were supported with covering of funeral expenses.
- forensic practitioners received the first session on forensic human identification in the recently opened Humanitarian Forensic Training Centre at the Dnipropetrovsk region MLB.
- **CIMIC officers** participated in a session on IHL obligations towards the dead. Four police officers participated in a training session on collection of fingerprints for identification purpose.



# Access to Education

**children and teachers** benefitted from ICRC in-kind support to canteens in educational facilities. 700

children and teachers on both sides of the LoC improved their knowledge of 1.400 mine/ERW risks thanks to educational sessions and theatre performances.

**children and teachers** benefitted from ICRC support to safety areas 500 (e.g. matrasses and blankets), provided to two schools.

- school teachers participated in training sessions on psychosocial support.
- **students** of an agricultural college received furniture for their rooms to 30 improve their living and study

pupils participated in craft workshops, organised by Red Cross volunteers 260 and aimed at creating friendly and safe environment, which was supported by the ICRC with materials.



### **Economic Security**

20,000

**people** received 17 kg food parcels each, which include buckwheat, rice, pasta, flour, sunflower oil, sugar, canned beef and sardines, tea and yeast; as well as parcels with essential hygiene items.

3,000

households received fertilizers, vegetables, greenhouse fittings and repair kits, etc. or cash support (GCA) for their farming activities.

2,600

around households were supported with cash (GCA), insulation kits and fuel (over 5,600 tons of coal in total) to improve their living conditions during winter.

- households and private entrepreneurs in GCA received grants for their business initiatives.
- affected people in the GCA received 460 monthly cash assistance to cover their basic needs.



#### **Detention**

- detainees, including 34 newly registered, were visited by ICRC delegates in 16 places of detention in
- short oral messages and written messages were exchanged between detainees and their families.
- penitentiary staff improved their knowledge of the international standards of treatment of detainees thanks to an ICRC seminar.



#### Mine Risk

1,200

around residents of localities along the LoC improved their knowledge of mine/ERW risks thanks to educational sessions.

- sets of equipment were donated to relevant structures on both sides of the LoC to support their demining activities.
- signs, four rolls of tape and seven banners were donated to the relevant structures to mark dangerous area.



# Cooperation with the URCS

Red Cross volunteers participated in joint distributions of aid, rehabilitation of houses, first aid provision, psychosocial support, risk awareness and safer behaviour programmes.

adults and children attended 11 over puppet shows, organized by URCS volunteers to provide psychological relief, with support of the ICRC.

around 700 elderly people living alone on both sides of the LoC were assisted by 107 Red Cross home-visiting nurses (e.g. help with housekeeping, maintenance of personal hygiene, etc.), supported by the ICRC.

patients residing close to the LoC were around assisted by four URCS mobile clinics, 1,900 with support of the Austrian Red Cross and the ICRC.
